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

Provincial Health Services Academy



Capacity building of the provincial health department in service delivery and governance of the health sector were major areas of health sector reforms agenda in 1990s. For this purpose, World Bank funded Family Health Project was launched in 1992. This project enabled the department to introduce structured training program for Inservice training by establishing Provincial Health Development Center (PHDC) and Divisional Health Development Centers (DHDCs).

To sustain the initiative the PHDC was raised to the status of first ever Provincial Health Services Academy (PHSA) in Pakistan which was later on granted the status of Attached Department under the administrative control of Health Department, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The main responsibilities of PHSA, inter alia, include pre-services education and training of paramedics, nurses and Lady Health Visitors (LHV's), in-service and refresher trainings of doctors and other cadres of staff of Health Department in addition to acting as technical arm of the Health Department in relation to training and capacity building of human resource.

Presently the PHSA is running a network of 24 institutions comprising of one Postgraduate College of Nursing, ten colleges of Nursing, one Postgraduate Paramedical Institute, three Paramedical Institutes of Medical Technologies, and four Public Health Schools for LHVs training and five Divisional Health Development Centers spread across the province along with the main Provincial Health Services Academy itself, in Peshawar.

All the BS Programs in the institutes under the PHSA network are affiliated with Khyber Medical University Peshawar Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Under the authority of Notification No.SO (Reg) 1-124 Dated 26th August 2002 and vide No.SOH(MTI)/2-1-General/2022 Dated: 23 May 2022 issued by the Health Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, all public sector hospitals in the province, including teaching hospitals and District Headquarters Hospitals are affiliated with the relevant paramedical training institutes under the PHSA Network for imparting clinical / practical training to the paramedical students through their staff which acts as teaching faculty in their respective discipline of medical technologies.

ZAB PGPI Peshawar



ZAB PGPI is housed in a state-of-the-art, purpose-built campus adjacent to PHSA, conveniently located just off the Northern Bypass interchange at Motorway M1, Peshawar. The institute provides a dynamic learning environment with modern facilities, including well-equipped classrooms with audiovisual aids, advanced laboratories, equipment, demonstration rooms, a museum, a library, an auditorium, and dedicated examination halls. A masjid and a canteen are also available on campus for students' convenience.

To facilitate students, transport services and separate hostel accommodations, ample capacity for both male and female students are also available in the institute.

The institute currently offers diplomas in 14 medical technologies, affiliated with the **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Medical Faculty**. Additionally, ZAB PGPI is affiliated with **Khyber Medical University** for **BS Programs in Allied Health Sciences**, further strengthening its academic offerings in the healthcare sector.

- (A) If a suitable candidate is not available then the seats remaining vacant, will be converted to open merit seat and will be filled accordingly.
- **(B)** All the seats except disable quota will be filled on the basis of merit.
- (C) Individual merit list will be maintained for each quota, for the purpose of selection. However, the selected candidates on quota seat will be merged (compete) in open merit for technology allocation.

Eligibility Criteria & Apply Guidelines

Eligibility Criteria & Application Guidelines

General Eligibility

Nationality: Pakistani Nationals only. **Domicile:** Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Gender: Male & Female.

Maximum Age Limit: (As on the last date of application submission)

For Fresh Candidates: 25 years. For In-Service Candidates: 35 years

Minimum Educational Qualification

FSc (Pre-Medical) or an equivalent qualification with at least overall 50% marks with science subject including Biology.

Candidates who have completed SSC and hold a two-year Paramedical Diploma from the KP Medical Faculty must submit an equivalency certificate from IBCC Pakistan, verifying that their diploma is equivalent to the F.Sc (Pre-Medical).

Mandatory Test:

KMU-CAT Test 2024 & onwards. Any candidate failing to appear in the KMU-CAT Test 2024 and onwards on the given date, time & venue due to any reason, whatsoever will not be considered for admission.

Who are In-Service Candidates?

Regular Civil Servants of KP Health Department, serving only in their relevant discipline (Technology) will be considered as In-Service candidate for admission in that specific discipline

Guidelines For Application Submission

- 1. A public notification will be published in leading newspapers to inform prospective candidates.
- 2. The prospectus, admission form, and application processing fee challan (Rs. 1000/-) can be downloaded from: www.zabpgpi.kp.gov.pk.
- 3. Candidates must submit two (02) sets of attested copies of the following documents along with the application form:
 - a) Original payment receipt of Rs. 1,000/- (deposited at designated banks).
 - **b)** Copy of KMU-CAT result.
 - c) Attested copies of SSC and FSc (Pre-Medical) certificates with detailed mark sheets.
 - d) Attested copy of domicile certificate.
 - e) Attested copy of the applicant's CNIC or Form-B.
 - f) Attested copy of the father/guardian's CNIC.
 - g) Character certificate from the last attended educational institution.
 - h) Attested Six (06) recent passport-sized photographs (White background).
 - i) Valid disability certificate (if applicable).
 - j) Hafiz-e-Quran Certificate from Wafaq-ul-Madaris Pakistan or its affiliated madrassa (if applicable).

Selection Criteria & Weightage

- 4. Incomplete or incorrectly filled applications will not be considered.
- 5. Candidates may apply for multiple technologies in a single application form, ranking their preferences. Once submitted, choices cannot be changed.
- 6. Admissions will be based on merit and the availability of preferred technologies.
- 7. If the preferred technology is unavailable, candidates will be allotted an alternative option.
- 8. Selected candidates must submit an affidavit (as per the provided template) on stamp paper after provisional selection.

9. In-Service Candidates

- a) Civil servants of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Health Department, working specifically in their respective fields and fulfilling the eligibility criteria, will be considered for admission in the same technology.
- b) Civil servants must provide a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Director General Health Services Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, ensuring it reaches the institute Principal before the interview date. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- c) In the event of a tie, preference will be given to candidates with more public sector experience in their relevant field.

10. Candidates With Physical Disabilities

- a) A valid disability certificate issued as per Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa regulations is required.
- b) If there is any ambiguity, the institute's selection committee may refer the case to the Standing Medical Board for verification and medical fitness assessment.
- c) If the Standing Medical Board deems a candidate unfit for a particular discipline, they may be considered for an alternative technology (if opted in the application form). If no alternative option is selected, the candidate will be removed from consideration. In case of tie, a candidate with lesser disability will be selected. The decision of the Selection Committee will be final.

Selection Criteria

After last date for submission of application form, general list will be uploaded to official websites. The applicants can submit their grievances if any in the general list through application submission at institute or through an official email i.e. (pgpipeshawar@phsa.edu.pk) within due time mentioned in advertisement. The amended final list for interviews will be uploaded on the same websites on expiry of grievances period.

In cases of uncertainty regarding the equivalence of academic qualifications, provisional admission will be subject to verification from the relevant educational authority. If any provided information is found false, misleading, or intentionally omitted, admission will be canceled without a fee refund, and legal action may be taken.

Weightage Formula

- 1. The weightage criteria for calculation of Aggregate Percentage (100%) should be as follows:
 - Secondary School Certificate (SSC) or Equivalent = 10%
 - Intermediate Pre-Medical / (HSSC) or Equivalent = 50%
 - o KMU-CAT result = 40%
- 2. After fulfilling minimum educational qualification, in case of hafiz-e-Quran an additional 20 marks, which will be added to their obtained F.Sc (Pre-Medical) marks before calculating to the 50% weightage.

Interviews & Final Selection List

Interviews For Selection

Based on the number of applicants, a suitable number of candidates will be shortlisted from the institutional merit list. However, no more than three (03) candidates per seat from all categories will be called for an interview. The interview will not contribute to the merit calculation. Its purpose is to:

- o Physically verify the candidate's identity.
- o Assess general composure, physical and mental fitness.
- o Scrutinize credentials (original documents) to ensure eligibility for admission.

If any doubts arise regarding a candidate's identity, fitness, or credentials, the interview committee may recommend appropriate action.

Non-appearance at the interview on the scheduled date, time, and venue will result in automatic disqualification from admission, even if the candidate qualifies on merit. No rescheduling of interviews will be allowed.

Final Selection List

- After completing the interview process, the final merit list and list of selected candidates will be prepared by the selection committee based on merit and choice of technology.
- o Once approved by the DG PHSA, the final list will be published on the official website (www.phsa.edu.pk)and on the institute's notice board as per the advertised schedule.
- o No individual notifications (call letters, offer letters, or phone calls) will be issued.
- o The admission offer is valid for five (05) working days after the final selection list is posted. Candidates must confirm their admission within this period.
- Failure to report within the given timeframe will result in the forfeiture of admission, and the seat will be offered to the next eligible candidate based on merit and choice of technology through the official website.

B. Major Penalties

- 1 Permanent Expulsion from Hostel.
- 2 Temporary Expulsion (Rustication) for up to one semester.
- 3 Permanent Expulsion from the Institute.

Rules & Regulations

Students at ZAB PGPI must follow all institutional rules to maintain a disciplined and professional learning environment.

Attendance Rules

- Minimum Requirement: 75% attendance in lectures, practicals, and clinical classes.
- Students below 75% attendance will not be allowed to sit for exams.
- * Students failing a subject must repeat classes before retaking exams.

Examination Rules

- ◆ One annual exam and one supplementary exam per subject per year.
- ★ KMU exams are conducted via an online system.

Exam Eligibility Requirements

- ✓ Submission of admission form with fee.
- ✓ Principal's certification of 75% attendance.

ACRs/PER & References (In-Service Students).

The Principal/Vice-Principal of the Institute will write ACRs/PER of the in-service students.

Library Rules

- ◆ Library card is mandatory for borrowing books.
- Reference books and periodicals cannot be taken outside without special permission.
- ◆ One book per course plus two additional books can be borrowed for 15 days (extendable).
- ★ Lost/damaged books must be replaced.
- ★ Late return fine: Rs. 50/- per day.
- ◆ Annual stock-taking suspends borrowing temporarily.
- ★ Library violations will be reported to the Principal.

Hostel Rules

- ◆ Limited accommodation preference given to students from remote areas.
- Unauthorized stay is strictly prohibited.
- ◆ Electric heaters, ACs, and extra appliances are not allowed.
- Hostel timings:

Winter: In by 8:00 PM Summer: In by 9:00 PM

- Written permission required for overnight stays outside hostel.
- Music, loud noises, and inappropriate behavior are not allowed.
- → Students must take care of their belongings—the Institute is not responsible for lost/stolen items.
- → Hostel rooms are subject to random inspection.
